Allergies Germs	Staff and pupils	Low	 We seek parental permission for children to interact with dogs Alternative activities are provided in a separate room for those with allergies Should the dog defecate on the school site, the Headteacher will clear this up immediately and dispose of it in a safe manner. The dog will be trained to toilet in an area of the school that our pupil's don't have access to on a regular basis if required the area will then be disinfected with an appropriate animal disinfectant. All immunisations are kept up to date and the Head Teacher keeps a register of this. Flea treatment is carried out at 6 weekly intervals. Worming treatment is carried out in line with European Vet guidelines, at 6 monthly intervals The dog will not go in the school dining hall at meal times; he will not be permitted into the food preparation area of the kitchen. Activities and games involving the dog Dog getting over excited The dog gets loose from his pen or from his lead.	Staff, pupils, dogs	Low	 Handler(s) remain with dogs at all times Handler(s) speak to school staff in advance and ensure the area and activity is safe We check with the handler(s) and set a limit for the number of children who can interact with a dog at once Handler(s) clean up urine and faeces School staff remove children who misbehave or upset dogs Time limit set on activities as, so dogs do not get tired The dog's crate/space is big enough for him to be happy and safe during the school day and the children are taught not too tease him. If the dog does get loose from his pen the Headteacher put the dog back in his pen. The dog will always be in the care of a responsible adult and will never be allowed to freely roam the school premises. Children are never left with the dog unsupervised. Pupils will be taught what to do to prevent the dog from chasing them. (i.e. stand still, cross arms) Children will be taught commands and expectations that are learnt by the dog through puppy training classes. 	Headteacher Staff member
