Since 1945 the end of World War Two in Europe has been marked by Victory in Europe Day, better known as VE Day. On 8th May 1945, Prime Minister Winston Churchill made an announcement on the radio at 3pm that the war in Europe had come to an end, following Germany's surrender the day before. This year, the 8th May 2020 will mark 75 years since the first VE Day. There had been plans to stage celebratory events and street parties in many places. Sadly, this has all had to be cancelled but many have chosen to celebrate virtually! Holding video parties, decorating our homes or baking to celebrate whilst we are all in lockdown!

Practise spelling common exception words. (Ages 5 and up)

Children in school learn to spell some word through the use of phonics. Some common words are 'tricky' and children need to learn them by heart. Home learning focus - To be able to use some description both verbally and when writing sentences and join ideas in sentences using words like 'and', 'because' and 'if'.

This lesson includes: a video to explain describing words and three activities to do at home

Union Jack Cake Topper

Decorate your cakes with mini Union Jack flags for the 75th anniversary of VE Day

What You Need

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Union Jack Template	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Broad Tip Marker Pens
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Sellotape Double Sided Tape	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• White Paper
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cocktail Sticks	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Scissors

How to Make

1. Print out or copy the template onto a sheet of white paper, then cut out the flags.
2. Use red and blue pens to colour in the Union Jack flag on the templates.
3. Turn the piece of paper over and stick a piece of double sided tape onto the back of the flag on the side where it is blank. Peel of the backing of the double sided tape.
4. Place a cocktail stick onto the back of the flag, next to the double sided tape, so that the end of the stick will poke out of the bottom of the flag.
5. Fold the section of paper that has the tape on over the cocktail stick to hold it in place, Then turn the flag back over. The section that you left blank in step 2 should have been folded over, leaving just the union jack on show.

Top Tip

Make sure the pointed end of the cocktail stick is pointed downwards, as it will make it easier to put it into the cupcake.


