<b>Maths - Puzzles</b>	<p>Using the numbers 12, 24, 71 Which is the odd one out? Why?</p> <p>Ch 2: Explain why another of the numbers is the odd one out.</p> <p>Ch 3: Explain a reason why all of the numbers could be the odd one out.</p>	<p><u>Alphabet Numbers:</u> Using any letter only once, what are the largest and smallest numbers that you can write down in words?</p> <p>Example: EIGHTY But not NINETY as N is used twice</p> <p>Ch 2: allow negatives such as MINUS TWO</p> <p>Ch 3: allow calculations such as TWO SQUARED</p>
<b>Reading</b>	<p>Using your favourite book, fiction or non-fiction, think of 5 questions you would like to ask one of the characters. Then write their answers as if you were that character. For example Elsie in the Ice Monster or Neil Armstrong in a book about Space.</p>	
<b>Writing</b> Don't forget the GoWrite writing competition!	<p>This week is Mental Health Week. The theme is Kindness. Write about how someone was kind to you. It doesn't have to be a large thing! What did they do? How did it make you feel? DO NOT use words like happy, sad, helped me etc. Choose the vocabulary you use carefully!</p>	
<b>Topic</b>	<p>This week is Mental Health Week. The theme is Kindness. Try to show one act of kindness every day this week. It could be a house-hold chore for your parents, helping a sibling or writing to an elderly relative who is struggling.</p>	
<b>Science</b>	<p>Soon it will be summer and we are having some spectacular weather. Your task is to create a weather diary showing the weather each day. You could add temperatures, make a rain gauge out of an old bottle or even a wind chime to listen to.</p>
