Maths	<p>If you were to produce a PowerPoint with 30 slides, how long would the PowerPoint last if each slide was on for 4 seconds? Could you read each message in 4 seconds?</p>
Reading	<div style="display: flex; align-items: flex-start;">  <div> <p>We want to create a video for the website similar to the one the staff produced for you. We want you to just take a photograph of yourself holding a message to your fellow class mates. For example Good Luck. (Like the one of me) You could show a positive, favourite memory instead of a message! Choose your words carefully for the best effect on the reader. Also, don't make it too long! I MUST HAVE YOUR PHOTOGRAPH BY MONDAY 15TH JUNE</p> </div> </div>
Writing	<p>If you do not want you on the website, then take a photograph of your work, with your first name on it, and I'll put that on. When you write your message remember to make it large enough for everyone to read. Also, remember it must be spelt and punctuated correctly!</p>
Topic	<p>Draw an image to go with your message/memory. Remember to use bold colours and go over your writing so it stands out.</p>
Computing	<p>Once you have taken the photograph, log onto Purple Mash and look at your alerts. You should find an email from me!</p>

	<p>Reply and attach your photograph to it. If you haven't used Purple Mash ask an adult to email the picture to school.</p>

	<p>Log onto TTRS and improve your multiplication skills. https://www.trockstars.com</p>
	<p>If you want to find safe online information suitable for children, you could try using Kiddle. Kiddle prioritises content that is child friendly and filters out most content aimed at adults and teens.</p>
